**QUESTION:**

Customer Migration and RDMs

At page 15 of the Revenue Decoupling Mechanism Panels' testimonies, NYSEG and RG&E proposes an adjustment to the RDM target if a flex rate or NYPA customer migrates to a service class within the scope of the RDM.

1. Will NYSEG and RG&E adjust the RDM if a customer migrates from a service class within the scope of the RDM to a service class outside the scope of the RDM? If so, how?
2. For NYSEG and RG&E separately, please provide the number of flex rate customers taking delivery service in the Historic Test Year.
3. For NYSEG, please provide the number of customers taking delivery service in the Historic Test Year that take commodity service from NYPA.

**RESPONSE:**

1. For all four businesses, the Company would adjust the RDM target if, during the year, a customer(s) whose annual revenues make up, say, 10% of the annual revenues of the service class move from a service class within the scope of the RDM to a service class outside the scope of the RDM or visa versa. Any target adjustment would be effective the next rate year. This threshold would apply to flex customer and NYPA customer movement as well.
2. For NYSEG, there were three flex rate customers taking delivery service in the historic test year.  
For RG&E, there were twelve flex rate customers taking delivery service in the historic test year.
3. As of June 2009, there were 62 NYPA customers taking delivery service from NYSEG. The NYPA programs during the test year include Economic Development Power (EDP), Expansion Power, and Power for Jobs (PFJ). The PFJ program is scheduled to end May 15, 2010; therefore, kWh usage for PFJ customers are included in the RDM exhibit, NYSEGRDM-3, Page 2 of 4
