Ms. Mahoney was the first woman to hold, and to be elected to, the position of County Executive of Onondaga County, New York where she served from January 1, 2008, through November, 2018. An attorney by trade, Ms. Mahoney worked in private practice before serving 5 years as a Criminal Prosecutor in the Onondaga County District Attorney's Office. In November 1999 she won election to the Syracuse Common Council and served a four year term.

Ms. Mahoney previously served as the Chief Operating Officer at the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry and previously served as an adviser at Upstate Medical University.
