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PROJECT OVERVIEW

As part of our commitment to provide safe, reliable service to all our customers, Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation (RG&E), in conjunction with our parent company – AVANGRID, is updating the delivery system in our service areas. These upgrades comply with new electric transmission reliability requirements. This electrical infrastructure work is a critical component of the City of Rochester's local reconstruction project. The relocation and reconnection of the impacted circuits and the corresponding new duct bank installation is required to accommodate the project's scope of work and is vital for its overall success.

EAST MAIN STREET PROJECT SCOPE INCLUDES:

- Coordination with the City of Rochester as part of their full reconstruction of East Main Street - from Goodman Street to Culver Road
- The relocation and reconnection of approximately 1.25 miles of five, 4 kV circuits & 2, 11 kV circuits.
- The installation of 2.0 miles of new underground duct banks.

In collaboration with The City of Rochester, the project's scope of work includes a full reconstruction of East Main Street - from Goodman Street to Culver Road (yellow line). The relocation of approximately one and a quarter mile of electrical circuits is critical to the success of the project, requiring reconnection to existing routes through two miles of new underground duct banks.
