Call 811 Before You Plant That Tree or Start **Any Project Requiring Digging**

Please be safe and have underground facilities marked before beginning any excavation work. Contractors are required by law - and all customers are strongly encouraged – to call Dig Safely New York at 811 two working days but not more than 10 working days before you plan to start your project.

^{**} RG&E electricity costs are based on an average residential customer monthly bill for 600 kilowatt-hours (kWh) of use and charged \$80 or 13.3 cents per kWh for both RG&E supply and delivery services.


